The main function of the MMD is to create a safer environment by providing additional contracted law enforcement; serve as an advocate for constituents to ensure their concerns are made known and addressed; develop community based events and projects to assist in attracting more residents, businesses, and investments; and work diligently to encourage interaction between residents and businesses to continuously enhance the District.

To be qualified to serve as a Director, a person must be 18 years old and fulfill one of the following criteria:

- A resident of the District;
- An owner of property in the District;
- An owner of stock, whether beneficial or otherwise, of a corporate owner of property in the District;
- An owner of a beneficial interest in a trust that owns property in the District; or
- An agent, employee, or tenant of a person covered by items (b), (c), or (d) above.

Directors serve four-year terms that expire on June 1 in odd-numbered years. Please include your home address on your resume.
