Midtown Houston Announces Recipients of Micro-Grants for Artists and Art Organizations

HOUSTON (OCT. 16, 2020) -- The Midtown Houston Cultural Arts and Entertainment Committee is pleased to announce the recipients of its 2020 micro-grants for artists and art organizations. These micro-grants, made possible by funding from the City of Houston Office of Cultural Affairs and the Houston Arts Alliance, recognize the importance of keeping arts and art appreciation alive during the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>Midtown Houston</u> has awarded six organizational grants of \$4,000 and seven individual artist grants of \$1,500, allowing artists and art organizations to fund free and open-to-the-public community cultural art projects and performances in Midtown. The projects selected align with the mission of the district which aims to provide an economically vibrant urban destination for residents and visitors alike. The grant recipients collaborated with area businesses and neighborhood partners to include them in their works. The projects are timely, relevant and will be a catalyst for uniting the community while supporting area businesses.
